

PARTTIME PRE-HARVEST HERBICIDE RESEARCH POSITION

There is a parttime research position focusing on pre-harvest herbicides. The review of applications will begin as documentation is received, and will continue until the position is filled.

Timeline for this job position:

This position will span over six or seven months depending in part on applicant's availability. Start date: as early as June 1st (September 1st at the latest) End date: end of November, or end of February.

Salary for this job position:

A total available salary for this parttime position of CAD 13,500.

Locations for these job positions:

North Campus, or remote, or St. Albert Research Station - depending on availability.

Roles and Objectives:

- To write a global synthesis paper focusing on pre-harvest herbicide options in spring wheat (to be submitted for journal peer-reviewed publication).
- To analyse, summarize, interpret and report experimental results emerging from pre-harvest herbicide research. Using ARM software (or similar) for reporting is an asset.
- To collaboratively contribute expert opinion on pre-harvest herbicide in annual crops as a research subject.

General description:

This work will deepen current understanding and applications on pre-harvest herbicide choices and best management. This will support grain harvestability and weed management as knowledge critically needed in spring wheat. This work will fill the gap and evaluate a broad range of herbicide options, efficacy and responses.

We welcome documentation from any applicant with strong work ethics and decisive interest in this research subject. Suitable candidates will have relevant degree(s) aligned with the position topic such as weed science, weed management and herbicides as well as comprehensive understanding of annual cropping systems.
